# Toolbox Talk

## **Packing a WRG Catering cooker**

Bringing the WRG Catering Cooker will inevitably take up a lot of space within our vans. This guide will provide you with the best method to load the cooker so it is secure and protected.

### Step 1:

- Put the whiteboard in its holder.
- Install the cooker with its back to the passenger side wheel-arch and tight against the front bulkhead.
- Put on brakes and strap it in to position .
- Install food box behind it.

#### Step 2:

- Install the fridge and the freezer with their backs to the driver side wheel-arch and tight against the front bulkhead and strap them in.
- Install the DVD unit on top of the fridge and the freezer and then the red box of cooker bits behind that and strap them in.

### Step 3:

- Load gas bottles and strap them in
- Load cool box, bin and cooks trolley as shown plus mops, brooms, etc.

### Step 4:

- Cover the middle seats, to protect them from grease, then load the griddle onto them.
- Strap it in securely taking the ratchet strap around the seats and through the griddle handles.
- Three curver boxes go on the floor. Burco and First Aid kit on top of them.
- Six curver boxes go on the back seat.
- Strap them in taking the ratchet strap around the head rests of the seats.

#### **Key Facts/Important Information:**

Make sure you pack <u>all</u> the bits of the Cooker; gas bottle(s), red box of burners, etc.

Make sure the gas connection at the rear of the cooker is not damaged during loading and the cooker is correctly lashed so it can't be damaged in transit

Do not load anything heavy or hard on top of the Cooker as it will damage the gas jets. Personal Protective Equipment bags are acceptable.
