I am writing to update you on the first Fund Britain's Waterways event, the Campaign Cruise at the Mailbox in Birmingham on Sunday 13th August. Sunday morning dawned grey and wet in Birmingham which were far from ideal conditions and it was remarkable just how many people showed their support.
