'Weekend of Action' - A call for enhanced Government support

Fund Britain's Waterways (FBW), a leading advocacy group championing the sustainable future of Britain's canals and rivers, announces a significant weekend of action planned for the upcoming May Day Bank Holiday, 4-6 May 2024.

Events will be taking place across the country on waterways managed by different inland navigation authorities, with the aim of mobilising nationwide support and highlighting the crucial need for increased government funding for the maintenance of Britain's 5,000 miles of inland waterways.

The weekend will feature a series of coordinated activities across various locations, each designed to showcase the cultural, economic, and environmental importance of maintaining our waterways.

Key Events Include:

- Electrika Brinklow Marina, Rugby 3-4 May: Electrika is the brainchild of Ortomarine, a renowned UK builder of electric narrowboats, with a passion for encouraging the industry towards "going green". In collaboration with Aquavista, the UK's largest inland marina operator, they will be organising and promoting this unique and innovative electric boating event.  your support for the waterways.



Westminster Campaign Cruise



The weekend of action will culminate with the Westminster Campaign Cruise, on Wednesday, 8 May 2024. This flagship event will see a flotilla of around 30 boats stand together off the Houses of Parliament and sound their horns to highlight the campaign to both the public and key decision makers. The flotilla includes over 20 privately owned canal boats, some of which will have travelled over 350 miles to reach Westminster.

The public are invited to join FBW supporters gathering on Westminster Bridge from 12:15pm to witness this spectacular on-the-water demonstration.

Parliamentarians and other dignitaries supporting the campaign have been invited to view the flotilla from the water on the specially chartered vessel, 'MV Valulla', including notable figures such as Sir Michael Fabricant MP and Professor Martin Bigg.

Sir Michael Fabricant commented: "Our canals and rivers and their associated towpaths and historic bridges, reservoirs, aqueducts and tunnels and other infrastructure all play an important part in the lives of millions of Britons. It is vital that we keep this 250-year-old heritage alive and maintained for the benefit of future generations."

FBW's efforts have already gathered significant momentum, with over 50,000 signatures on their public petition advocating for better policies and support.

Campaign supporter Griff Rhys Jones OBE, Patron of the River Stour Association and the Stour and Orwell Association commented: "Our rivers and waterways are the essential lifeblood to Great Britain. If we abuse or neglect or poison, block or ignore, pollute, damage over-exploit, drain, choke or infect our natural water supplies, then the health of the entire nation is at risk. As a treasured public asset, the government must help to keep them running, clean and beautiful. The navigation authorities and the thousands of volunteers who help care for our waterways need more support from government to maintain this critical network."

Sir Tim Smit KBE, Founder of the Eden Project said: "Funding Britain's Waterways is one of the most important investments our nation can make. They are the arteries which link our country together in a magnificent fusion of industry, potential and pleasure. There is no other national asset

so perfectly designed to enable citizens to enjoy Britain's beautiful countryside and be inspired by past generations to help address today's social and environmental challenges. For me, most importantly they provide access for millions of people to take in the clean air of the country, set in landscapes that still seduce the imagination with dreams of living within nature and being an active part of it."

While the Rt Hon Wendy Morton MP added: "This campaign cruise illustrates the passion and concern people have for the future of our amazing network of inland waterways. It highlights the importance of safeguarding the network for future generations to enjoy whilst also helping bring economic prosperity to local communities such as those within my own constituency."
