Afternoon Activities - Guided Walk

Attendees will have the opportunity to take part in a Guided Heritage Walk in the afternoon.

Our guide for the afternoon walk will be award-winning CRT volunteer Rob Hetherington. The tour will start at Castle Gardens on what has become known as the "Mile Straight" of the Grand Union Canal Leicester Line, which is a canalised section of the River Soar. From there Rob will take us along the navigation to Lime Kiln Lock, where the IWA national rally of boats was held in 1967, and enlighten us with numerous historic insights en route. The distance is approx. 3 miles, which will take about 2 hours for a leisurely stroll, including commentary stops and your unguided return to De Montfort University via the city centre.



Parking

All campus car parks are pay and display. Parking is £2 up to 4 hours, over 4 hours it is £4. On road parking is free after 6pm but space is not guaranteed.

- The closest car park is Edith Murphy LE1 5RR, right in front of the Hugh Aston Building Entrance. This is situated off a slip road which runs form the end of The Newarke. Only attendees with accessibility requirements are advised to use the Edith Murphy car park, where there are 6 Blue Badge parking bay(s).
- John Whitehead car park LE2 7BY. Members with no accessibility issues are kindly advised to use the John Whitehead car park, at only 4 min walking distance from the Hugh Aston Building. This would leave room to members with mobility issues to access the closer Edith Murphy car park.



The nearest Train station is Leicester.

The Hugh Aston Building is 16 minutes walking distance from Leicester Station.

By bus: take bus 15/22/31A/44A/47 from Prebend Street for 2 stops. Stop at Charles Street and walk for 11 minutes.

Alternatively, take bus HOP in Station Street, Stand EG. Stop at Granby Street and walk for 9 minutes.
